Canadian Intermediate Math Contest and Canadian Senior Math Contest

(University of Waterloo)

Before registering for the contest, please make sure you are able to have an adult supervise you at home on the day of the contest. The contest will be held on:

November 18, 2020, 10:30 am to 12:30 pm for Cohort A

November 19, 2020, 10:30 am to 12:30 pm for Cohort B

Cost: \$12

Steps to participate in the contest:

- Step 1: Pay for the contest via School Cash online. The cost is \$12. This is to cover the cost of marking. Registration will be begin on October 19, 2020 and will close on October 28, 2020. There will be no extensions.
- Step 2: The following week, you will be sent a Google Form. The form will collect your student number, ask for your name, which contest you have signed up for (CIMC for grades 9 and 10 and CSMC for grades 11 and 12) and **which cohort you will be in during Rotation #5** (Nov 10 – 26, period 1 will be face to face at that time). **It is imperative that you fill this form out correctly**, as this will determine which contest you will be sent and on which day. The form must be completed by November 9.
- Step 3: About 3 to 4 days before the contest day, you will be sent electronic copies of the Student Information Form, Solution Booklet, and Remote Supervisor Instructions via your school gapps account. Read the forms carefully. These forms will need to be returned **by you directly to the University of Waterloo** after the contest. It is your responsibility to complete the forms accurately.
- Step 4: A few minutes before the start of the contest, you will receive an electronic copy of the contest paper from Ms.Sinatra or Ms.Park. The contest will be held on Nov 18 from 10:30 am to 12:30 pm for Cohort A and Nov 19 from 10:30 am to 12:30 pm for Cohort B. **Students will write the contest remotely from home supervised by an adult.** These dates and times were to coincide with a day when you are NOT scheduled to be at school for a face to face class. Please still let your teacher know that you will be writing a math contest that day (this is especially important if your teacher requires you to participate in the face to face to class when you are at home.)
- Step 5: After writing the contest, you will need to send back the Student Information Form, Solution Booklet, and anything else listed in the Remote Supervisor Instructions.

The University of Waterloo and the RHHS math department have taken the time to create a method by which the contests can still run, because participation is most important to us. **Please respect these efforts and help keep the integrity of the contest. Do not discuss the contest with anyone from the time the contest commences to 48 hours after the contest is complete.**
